FY2024 – Amendment # 1 – Administrative Modification The following outlines changes made to the TIP:

Action Taken:

Non-Profit transit projects (specifically for Seniors or the Disabled) are funded with 5310 FTA federal dollars and must be listed in the LHMPO's TIP. However, these projects have no impact on LHMPO fiscal constraint or other regional funding; Any changes made to the 5310 Transit section of the TIP are considered Administrative.

FY2024 – Amendment # 2 – Administrative Modification.

Action Taken:

Added TA Projects into the TIP:

State Transportation Alternative (TA) Program grant applications require that MPOs list the projects on our regional TIPs under a "Parking-Lot" status (indicating unapproved/unawarded) as part of the grant application submittal process. The Lake Havasu MPO submitted a competitive TA grant application to ADOT for the FY24/25 Call for Projects. As a result, the LHMPO was awarded a Safe Routes to School Scoping grant. Therefore, the parking-lot project listed on the TIP for FY24/25 was revised accordingly with the eligibility award letter.

Competitive TA projects have no impact on the LHMPO fiscal constraint or other regional funding; Any changes made to the TA section of the TIP are considered <u>Administrative</u>.

FY2024 – Amendment # 3 – Administrative Modification

Action Taken:

ADOT notified the LHMPO of several changes made to our regional *Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) projects* that were awared for the FY25-26 grant cycle; The changes were due to construction cost increases and or overall programming strategy to finalize the ADOT five year program FY25-29.

In addition to changes to the FY25-26 HSIP Projects, the LHMPO as also placed the upcoming FY27-28 projects into the TIP under the parking lot status (not awarded, still in application phase)

Any changes made to the HSIP section of the TIP are considered <u>Administrative</u>.

SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG), and Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) funds are the federal funds allocated to the LHMPO for transportation-related projects every fiscal year. Any funds not directly tied to a project are considered unencumbered or lapsing if not expended (i.e., STBG/CRP funds are considered "use it, or lose it" each fiscal year). Any lapsing funds at the end of the fiscal year risk being swept by ADOT. In order for the LHMPO to carry forward lapsing or unencumbered federal funds, we must "Loan-Out" the funds to ADOT or another COG/MPOs in the fiscal year the funds are scheduled to expire. We then receive "Repayment" in the following fiscal year or future fiscal years.

SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

The LHMPO will need to amend the FY24-25 work program to include one (1) new project related to data collection.

The following outlines the specifics of the proposed project/activity:

1. Purchase Radar Traffic Counters – The LHMPO will purchase Radar traffic counters for Lake Havasu City to aid in the data collection efforts for the HPMS/TCDS traffic count program. The new counters/units will improve the efficiency of the traffic counting operation by systematically replacing outdated & damaged equipment and supporting increased counting requirements resulting from the expansion of Functional Classifications (The list of classified roads that require counts was expanded circa 2020). In addition, the new units will support the ongoing traffic counting operations at long-duration count site locations. The allocated budget for this purchase would be \$40,000 (SPR funds).

Proposed Data Collection & Traffic Count Activities:

HPMS

The LHMPO in coordination with local agencies will work to ensure:

- Traffic data collected is posted to the web-based Traffic Count Data System (TCDS) database annually where it can be reviewed, processed, and analyzed by ADOT (lhmpo.ms2soft.com).
- Local-collected traffic data for purposes of uploading to the TCDS database, meets duration and formatting requirements specified by ADOT
- A comprehensive set of updated traffic counts be collected at a frequency no less than the minimum count cycle stated in the above Table 1 (i.e., a 3-year cycle for principal arterials and a 6-year cycle for minor arterials and collectors)
- Coordination with the ADOT Data Management and Analysis Section to receive and present training on data collection for local jurisdictions, as needed.
- Encourage and support local traffic counting programs already in existence.
- Purchase Radar Traffic Counters The LHMPO will purchase Radar traffic counters for Lake Havasu City to aid in the data collection efforts for the HPMS/TCDS traffic count program. Functional Classification

The LHMPO in coordination with local agencies will work to ensure:

- Maintenance and monitoring of the current inventory of the region's functional classification of roadways and urban boundaries, according to federal regulations and state procedures.
- The use of the AZGeo ArcGIS Web Portal to review and request functional classification changes.
- Coordination with the ADOT GIS to receive and present training on functional classification, as needed.
