#### 1. Call to Order

Chairman Sheehy called the meeting to order at 2:00pm.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Sheehy led in the pledge of Allegiance.

#### 3. Roll Call

The Roll Call was performed by Director Justin Hembree Present: Chairman; Cal Sheehy, Vice Chairman; Buster Johnson, Secretary/Treasurer; David Lane, Board Members; Jeni Coke, and Gary Knight.

#### 4. Title VI - Notice to the Public

The Title VI notice to the public was read by Director Justin Hembree.

#### 5. Call to the Public

There was no request to address the Board.

#### 6. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Meeting Minutes: May 11, 2021

Secretary David Lane presented a motion to approve the May 11, 2021, Meeting Minutes. Motion was seconded by Board Member Jeni Coke.

#### 7. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve FY2021 Title VI Nondiscrimination Plan:

Director Justin Hembree presented the FY21 Title VI nondiscrimination plan and the FY21 annual Title VI goals and accomplishments report. Mr. Hembree noted that the plan now includes Exhibit E, which identifies the revisions made within the plan and the pages in which those revisions were made. The added Exhibit E will aid in future navigation of updates/revisions made annually to the Title VI Plan. Mr. Hembree announced no Title VI complaints were received during FY21 and that the MPO is compliant with all Title VI requirements.

Secretary David Lane presented a motion to approve the FY2021 Title VI Nondiscrimination Plan. Motion was seconded by Vice-Chairman Buster Johnson.

## 8. Discussion and possible action to Approve the FY25-26 Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Applications:

Director Hembree provided an update on the tentative timeline for ADOT's FY25-26 HSIP call for projects and that the official call should be announced by ADOT circa mid to late August of 2021. Mr. Hembree discussed the top projects identified by Greenlight Traffic Engineering based on a recent crash data safety analysis. Based on the data analysis, Mr. Hembree recommended that Greenlight Traffic Engineering and or Lake Havasu MPO submit the following top four (4) Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) applications to ADOT for the FY25-26 call-for-projects cycle.

#### 1. State Route 95 - Raised Median:

- S. Palo Verde to Industrial Blvd (0.8 miles), N. Palo Verde to North of Chenoweth (2.2 miles), S. Acoma to Oro Grande (1.0 miles)
- a) 6 fatal crashes, 10 serious injury crashes
- b) \$4,000,000
- c) 13.5 B/C ratio

#### 2. McCulloch Blvd (Capri Blvd to Smoketree Ave):

Resurface, Wider Markings, Speed Feedback Signs, 0.5 miles

- a) 1 fatal crash, 4 serious injury crashes
- b) \$500,000
- c) 12.2 B/C ratio

#### 3. Swanson Ave Intersections (Wing Loop, Mariposa Dr, and Wing Loop):

Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacons, High Visibility Crosswalks

- a) 3 serious injury pedestrian crashes
- b) \$250,000
- c) 5.3 B/C ratio

#### 4. Horizon 6 - Gold Springs Rd, Blue Canyon Rd:

Widen 3 Feet, Restripe for 10' Lanes

- a) 2 serious injury crashes
- b) \$250,000
- c) 4.0 B/C ratio

Vice-Chairman Buster Johnson presented a motion to approve the top four (4) HSIP applications to ADOT for the FY25-26 call-for-projects cycle. Motion was seconded by Secretary David Lane.

#### 9. ADOT District Report (Information Only)

Todd Steinberger, ADOT NW Assistant District Engineer updated the Executive Board on the progress of projects within the region.

#### 10. Arizona Transportation Board Report (Information Only)

Gary Knight, District Representative reports the Arizona Transportation Board had no new updates but announced that the next State Transportation Board meeting would be held virtually on August 20, 2021.

#### 11. Rural Transportation Advocacy Council (RTAC) Report (Information Only)

Kevin Adam, RTAC Executive Director – Mr. Adam provided state and federal legislative updates. State general revenues were high last year and the state legislators earmarked over \$300 million toward Arizona infrastructure projects. Mr. Hembree and Mr. Adam provided information on the upcoming Rural Transportation Summit as well as the Greater Az COG/MPO legislative project and strategy for the upcoming 2022 state legislative session. Mr. Hembree announced that the tentative project prioritized was Swanson Ave. Improvements (Lake Havasu Ave. to Smoketree Ave.). The project is a mill and fill pavement preservation project with additional improvements to striping and ADA ramps as needed. The LHMPO legislative project and joint resolution are tentatively schedule for LHMPO Board approval in September of 2021.

#### 12. LHMPO Director's Report (Information Only)

Mr. Hembree announced that the Kittelson Team working on the long-range 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) was wrapping up a public survey and is now moving on to the project identification and prioritization portion of the planning process.

#### SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

This memo outlines the amendments necessary to the FY2021-2026 LHMPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for **FY2021 – Amendment # 8**(Consolidated Amendment including subsections 8.1 - 8.7)

#### > <u>FY2021 - Amendment # 8.1 - Formal</u>

#### Add STBG Project "LHM-22-114" into TIP for FY22:

The Lake Havasu MPO recently received approval for the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for fiscal years 2022 & 2023. The UPWP identified and allocated funding for an STBG project in FY22 for the purpose of hiring a consultant to perform 5-year crash data analysis, facilitate prioritizing of HSIP eligible projects, provide Performance Measure reports comparing LHMPO regional numbers to ADOT established targets, and create applications on behalf of Lake Havasu City for FY27/28 HSIP funding.

The project was approved in the UPWP, however, the project must also be listed in the regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for fiscal constraint reporting purposes (I.E. budget tracking).

#### FY2021 - Amendment # 8.2 - Formal

#### Delete STBG Project "LHM-22-107" from TIP:

Circa May of 2019, Lake Havasu MPO received approval through the TAC and Executive Board to program STBG funds in FY23 (Design) & FY24 (Construction) for improvements to London Bridge Rd. Improvements included:

- Installing bike lanes (including markings/signs),
- · Restriping narrower travel lanes, and
- Installing speed feedback signs.

Shortly after LHMPO programed the STBG funds for the safety-related activities, ADOT announced a "call-for-projects" for the competitive grant-based HSIP funds in FY23-24. Lake Havasu City submitted and was awarded, competitive HSIP grant competitive funds in FY23 & FY24 to make improvements to London Bridge Rd. (same improvements listed under the STBG project scope), which means the original STBG funding allocated to the plan can be returned to the region to reprogram/reallocate to other infrastructure projects.

#### FY2021 - Amendment # 8.3 - Administrative

#### Delete HSIP Project "LHM-23-101" from TIP:

State HSIP grant applications require that MPO's list the projects on our regional TIP's under a "Parking-Lot" status (indicating unapproved/unawarded) as part of the grant application submittal process. Circa summer 2019, ADOT announced that competitive grant-based HSIP funds were available in FY23-24 and that COG's/MPO's could pursue a portion of those funds to update our local safety plans. Lake Havasu MPO submitted a competitive HSIP grant application to ADOT in hopes of securing funding to update the 2016 safety plan. Unfortunately, LHMPO was **NOT** awarded HSIP grant funds for FY23 to update our safety plan, therefore, the parking-lot project LHM-23-101 listed on the TIP for FY23 can be removed.

#### > FY2021 - Amendment # 8.4 - Administrative

#### Reschedule HSIP Project "LHM-18-108D/C" in TIP:

Lake Havasu City was originally awarded HSIP funding for the Swanson and Acoma Signal project for ADOT's FY21-22 grant cycle. The original budget for the project was roughly \$725k (covering both the Design and Construction Phases). After HSIP projects are awarded, they are assigned an ADOT Project Manager (PM) who reviews the details of the project prior to initiating a contract with local agencies (IGA creation). After the ADOT PM reviewed this specific project, they suggested a new project cost estimate that was higher than originally budgeted and awarded, in turn, the LHMPO hired Greenlight TE to perform a detailed analysis, which included a revised scope and budget. Greenlight TE's analysis identified the need to increase HSIP funding for the project by roughly \$324k. ADOT graciously agreed to cover the overages for the project with the caveat that the Design and Construction phases be deferred an entire fiscal year until additional HSIP funds become available (I.E. a project schedule delay). ADOT has provided a revised eligibility (award) letter, both Federal and Local funding levels, have been reconfigured and new totals established.

Due to the revised schedule, scope, and budget, the Swanson and Acoma Signal project will need to be reprogrammed in the TIP.

#### SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

As you may already be aware, the Arizona State Legislature is showing an increasing interest in infrastructure investment and may favor earmarking \$50,000,000 in State surplus general fund revenues for infrastructure projects across Arizona as a single bill during the 2022 Legislative session. Should the bill pass, the overall funding available to the Lake Havasu MPO region will be \$1,687,775 as estimated by the Rural Transportation Advocacy Council (RTAC). Based on projected funding availability provided by RTAC, It is recommended that the Lake Havasu MPO submit the following top prioritized project for the **2022 Greater Arizona Set-Aside/Earmarked** funding:

#### 1. Swanson Ave. Improvements:

- Lake Havasu Ave. to Smoketree Ave.
- Mill and Fill, ADA Ramp Upgrades, and Restriping as necessary
- 0.6 Miles
- \$1,687,775

Swanson Avenue is a major arterial for Lake Havasu City, a significant roadway which forms the McCulloch downtown corridor (Mesquite, McCulloch, Swanson, handling over 40,000 vehicles per day). Swanson Avenue itself averages between 10,000 and 12,000 vehicles per day and serves the Post Office, two major grocery stores, connects ASU with SR 95 and serves as a major connector between the major north-south routes in the community (Acoma, LH Avenue and SR 95). The entire route is lined with businesses and multi-family residential. This portion of Swanson (Smoketree to LH Avenue) was last reconstructed in the early 1990's. The other portions of Swanson (Acoma to Smoketree) was reconstructed in 2019 and the Smoketree/Swanson Intersection was reconstructed in 2020.

An emergency chip seal was applied on this section of roadway approximately 5 years ago to keep the roadway from falling apart while we tried to program the required rehabilitation. The roadway has severe underlying cracking, rutting and raveling. The recommended rehabilitation is a 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " mill and 3" overlay (2/  $\frac{1}{2}$ " at the curb line) with fog seal. ### **Swanson Avenue Improvements**

The \$1,687,775 equates to six (6) years worth of funding for the Lake Havasu MPO compared to our standard federal apportionment.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-01**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE LAKE HAVASU METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION, URGING STATE LAWMAKERS TO FUND THE PROJECTS INCLUDED IN THE RTAC RURAL REGIONAL PRIORITY PROJECT LIST

**WHEREAS**, the quality of Arizona's transportation infrastructure is vital to public safety, economic prosperity, environmental health, quality of life and cost of living, and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Transportation currently assesses the investment backlog for the Nation's highways and bridges at \$756 billion while ADOT's current long-range plan estimates the state's unmet needs at \$30.5 billion, equating to only 43% of the needs being met, and

**WHEREAS**, the Arizona funding gap is continually expanding and currently equates to at least \$1.22 billion a year every year in under-investment just on the state system, and

**WHEREAS**, Arizona's local road networks, heavily dependent on state fuel tax revenue which has not been raised in roughly 30 years, face comparable shortfalls, estimated at \$2.2 billion just for the maintenance of existing county roads, and

**WHEREAS,** in recent years, the Arizona Legislature has increased transportation investment through earmarking one-time State General Fund revenues for various projects, a process which has proven to be politically viable at least partially due to the specificity of the use of the funding, and

**WHEREAS**, earmarking has funded critically needed highway and road projects but bypasses the established programming processes that prioritize needs and maximize the development of the best investment choices based on available revenue, processes that are increasingly important due to the magnitude of the under-investment levels, and

**WHEREAS**, the Greater Arizona transportation planning organizations (COG/MPOs) have the ability to provide a compromise approach by developing a list of specific projects for earmarking but those that have been vetted and determined to be the top priorities for each Greater Arizona region, and

**WHEREAS**, the \$50 million sought for these Greater Arizona regional priorities will likely represent a small fraction of the available funding, considering the \$320 million appropriated this year, providing lawmakers with ample opportunity to fund additional projects.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** the Executive Board of the Lake Havasu Metropolitan Planning Organization urges state lawmakers to enact legislation appropriating State General Fund revenues for the projects selected for the RTAC Rural Regional Priority Project List.
