1. Call to Order

Chairman Sheehy called the meeting to order at 2:06 pm.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Sheehy led in the pledge of Allegiance.

3. Roll Call

The Roll Call was performed by Sarah Lojewski Present: Chairman; Cal Sheehy, Vice Chairman; Buster Johnson, Board Member; Jeni Coke, and Board Member Gary Knight.

4. Call to the Public

There was no request to address the Board.

5. Meeting Minutes: April 12, 2022

Board member Gary Knight motioned to approve April 12, 2022, Meeting Minutes. The motion was seconded by member Jeni Coke.

6. Title VI Plan & Annual Report

ADOT, FHWA, and FTA require a Title VI-Nondiscrimination Plan from each recipient of federal transportation funding within the state of Arizona. The Lake Havasu MPO Title VI Plan ensures fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people during the planning, development, evaluation, and implementation of Federal-aid programs and activities. In addition, ADOT also requires an annual report indicating the current year's public involvement, modifications made to the Title VI Plan, and the upcoming year's goals.

The following is a brief description of Title VI activities during the fiscal year 2022:

- 1. Lake Havasu MPO did not receive any Title VI complaints during FY 2022
- 2. The annual Title VI Plan has been updated, FY 2022 updates are located in Exhibit E at the back of the Plan
- 3. The FY 2022 Annual Title VI Report is complete.

- 4. On February 22, 2022, LHMPO had an On-Site Title VI Compliance Review (Audit). On May 3, 2022, LHMPO received a letter from the ADOT Civil Rights Office stating that the LHMPO is in full compliance with Title VI regulations.
- 5. The LHMPO will submit the FY22 Title VI plan and annual report to ADOT by the August 1, 2022 deadline.

Board member Jeni Coke motioned to approve the Title VI Plan and Annual report. The motion was seconded by Vice-Chairman Buster Johnson.

7. FY2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Amendment #2

The LHMPO Executive Board initially adopted the FY22-23 Work Program on May 11, 2021. However, the federal government recently passed a new five-year transportation bill called the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act" (IIJA). Consequently, with the passing of the IIJA coupled with the new 2020 Census population figures, the federal apportionment/authorization distribution formula for COGs and MPOs nationwide has been recalculated. The Lake Havasu MPO has received increased funding apportionments for fiscal years 2022 and 2023.

The following are changes made to the FY22-23 UPWP:

- 1. Updated the TAC and Executive Board roster on Pg. 5
- 2. Added description of the newly established federal "Carbon Reduction Program" Pg. 9
- 3. Updated the Annual Budget Summary Tables FY2022-2023 Pg. 10-12.
- 4. Updated LHMPO-LHC Budget Tables FY22 & FY23 Pg. 27-28

Vice-Chairman Buster Johnson motioned to approve the FY 2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Amendment #2. The motion was seconded by member Gary Knight.

8. FY2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #2

The following changes have been made to the TIP:

- 1. LHMPO deleted the HSIP project "LHM-18-108D" Acoma Boulevard and McCulloch Boulevard Safety Improvements (AKA Swanson/Acoma Traffic Signal).
- 2. The LHMPO added an HSIP project "LHM-H23-101" McCulloch Blvd and Jamaica Blvd Traffic Signal.

Vice-Chairman Buster Johnson motioned to approve the FY 2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #2. The motion was seconded by member Jeni Coke.
