1. CALL TO ORDER - (Cal Sheehy)

Chairman Sheehy called the meeting to order at 2:00 P.M.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE - (Cal Sheehy)

Chairman Sheehy led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Roll Call - (Sarah Lojewski)

Sarah Lojewski performed Roll Call

Present: Chairman; Cal Sheehy, Vice-Chairman Nancy Campbell, board member Jeni Coke, and Secretary Sonny Borrelli.

4. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Minutes: June 10, 2025, Regular Meeting & June 10, 2025, Special Executive Meeting.

Sonny Borrelli motioned to approve both of June's Meeting Minutes on June 10, 2025. Jeni Coke seconded the motion.

5. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the LHMPO Title VI Plan and Annual Report.

Sarah Lojewski, LHMPO Director presented a Title IV Plan and Annual Report.

Sonny Borrelli motioned to approve LHMPO Title VI Plan and Annual Report with the noted changes. Nancy Campbell seconded the motion.

6. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve an Administrative Amendment to the FY26-30 Transportation Improvement Program

- Administrative Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment to: 1) revise construction and design phase costs for CRP project, 2) Move CRP project design phase to FY26, and 3) Transit project funding increase.

Sarah Lojewski, LHMPPO Director

Nancy Campbell motioned to approve the administrative Amendment #3 to the FY2026-FY2030 Transportation Improvement Program as presented. Jeni Coke seconded the motion.

7. RTAC Priority Projects Discussion

Call for projects to be included in RTAC FY26 list of priority projects for legislative action.

Sarah Lojewski, LHMPPO Director, made a call for projects to be included in the RTAC FY26 list of priority Legislative projects.

Lojewski explained, LHC worked hard to complete their PCI (pavement condition Index) analysis in Havasu and we are waiting for the results. Based on the results the city will compile a list of projects with cost & data for the RTAC Projects list by the end of August. The call for projects is still open and we'll be updating those project sheets as we get them.

Council Member Campbell expressed her concerns about 5 intersections that she feels is the most dangerous intersection in Havasu and need to be signalized similar to the Mulbury intersection. The MPO has created a project description sheet for an Intersection Improvement Study of these locations.

Nancy also added an additional landscaping project along SR95 to improve appearance and add purple flunts.

The Board approved these projects and approved the MPO to work with the City to compile a list of projects from the PCI analysis.

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8. Presentation and Discussion of the Legislative Reports on Current Legislation by the Rural Transportation Advocacy Council (RTAC).

•Current Legislative updates

Kevin Adam, RTAC Executive Director, provided a state and Federal legislative update to the Board.

9. Discussion of the Current Updates of Pavement Preservation Projects in the Region by ADOT District Engineer.

Todd Steinberger, P.E. Northwest Assistant District Engineer, advised the Board on the updates for the projects in the region.

- The raised median on SR 95 from S. Palo Verde to Price
- I-40 Pavement Preservation from the CA State Line to Needle Mtn. TI
- I-40 Pavement Preservation from Needle Mtn TI to SR 95 TI
- West Kingman System to System TI in Kingman

Mayor asked Mr. Steinberger if the project called for reflectors on the raised median or if some kind of improvement could be made to make the medians visible during the night. Mr. Steinberger replied he would look at the plans and get back to the Board with his findings.

Council Member Diaz, during open discussion with the public, he expressed concerns of the width of the Median on SR95.
